SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE MINUTES September 14, 2017

A meeting of the First Parish full Social Justice committee was held on Sept. 14, 2017 at the church. Present were: Janet Dye, Frankie Finnegan, Betty Gilson and Rev. Rachel Tedesco. The following issues were discussed and decided.

The bank balance is \$2,441.77 of which \$269.75 is for the *Read to Me, Father* program.

Report form the SJC core committee

- a. The Raise Up Mass. Campaign began today in Brockton. We're working with the Coalition for Social Justice (CSJ) and the Brockton Interfaith Community (BIC) for two bills: Fight for \$15 (minimum wage) and Paid Family and Medical Leave. The kickoff meeting was held this afternoon at the Brockton Public Library, 304 Main Street. Rachel will check on film to show some evening.
- b. BSU Martin Richard Institute for Social Justice (MRISJ)is holding a fund-raising concert on Sunday, October 1 at 3:00 pm at BSU Rondileau Campus Center Auditorium. See poster.
- c. Proposed "School of the Prophets" training by Will Dickerson, BIC Director, beginning in October. (Four 2-hour sessions; dates TBA). To teach techniques of conducting 1:1 meetings between congregation members. Purpose: to discover what issues matter most to people; where our true passions lie. Rachel will send out notices on these meetings.
- d. Proposed "No Place for Hate" signs. We agreed to purchase a few from the First Parish Church in Taunton. They can be hung at church, give to local organizations and businesses, and sold to parishioners. Rachel will ask Rev. Paul to order a dozen.
- e. UU Mass Action Our church is still a supporting member, but Rachel resigned from executive state board.
- f. Conference on Mass Incarceration- The New Jim Crow, January 20, 2018 at All Souls Church in Braintree. Rachel was contacted by George Goss, their SJC Chair. Some of us will try to attend this.
- g. The Annual Coming Out Day program with the Pride Office at BSU will be held on Tues., Oct. 3 from 11:00 am noon. The theme is *Getting to Know UU*. We will be serving a light brunch. A BSU student is making a flyer for us to post. Volunteers are needed to do the brunch. Janet will bring fruit and Betty will make Twists.

Report from First Principle Project

- a. The *Read to Me, Father* group is working on a special program for the Fathers' Group at Old Colony Correctional Center. It is a 12 week program *Nurturing Fathers*. Sonia D'Alarcao has been trained to lead the program through her work at BAMSI. Some of the tutors met earlier this week to plan the first two classes starting on Oct. 4.
- b. We discussed whether or not we should get a separate Black Lives Matter flag. The group decided that for now we should just fly the We Believe banner and work on specific activities for BLM.

- 2. Donated \$100.00 from Metal recycling project and \$67.50 from the 4th of July event to Bridgewater Food Pantry
- 3. CD/DVD & jewel cases recycling is available.
- 4. Little Free Library Pat Hart with Frank Yeatman's help is almost ready to place this at the Bridgewater MBTA Station.
- 5. Solstice sign has been hung under wayside pulpit.
- 6. Updated info for SJC brochure.
- 7. In partnership with Bridgewater Green Committee we will be collecting/distributing reusable bags at AutumnFest.

Report for Peace Committee

- a. The annual Peace Celebration will be held at the Sept. 24 morning service. People will gather at the Peace Pole for readings and song both before and after morning worship.
- b. Peter Jansen will play Gathering Music and the Offertory.

Future talks will be on Immigration in October, Health Justice in November and Just Policing in December.
